

Complete recipes typed or printed must accompany entries. Only whole pies may be entered. Disposable pans are to be used as no pie plates or pans will be returned. All entries become the property of the Leavenworth County 4-H Foundation. Prizes will be awarded in three divisions; Youth, 18 and under; Adult, 19-59; Senior 60 and older years of ages.
- **Top Prizes will be sponsored by Cereal Ingredients Inc**. The first two award winning pies in each division will be auctioned off prior to the Livestock Sale on Friday about 6:00p.m. in the Livestock Arena.
