All entries become the property of the Leavenworth County 4-H Foundation. Prizes will be awarded in three divisions; Youth, 18 and under; Adult, 19-59; Senior 60 and older years of ages.
- **Top Prizes will be sponsored by CII Foods.** The first two award winning pies in each division will be auctioned off prior to the Livestock Sale on Friday about 6:00p.m. in the Livestock Arena. All pies must be covered upon arrival. **All entries become the property of the Leavenworth County 4-H Foundation.** Prizes will be awarded in three divisions: Youth (18 and under), Adult (19-59), and Senior (60 and older). The first two award winning pies in each division will be sold at auction Friday evening, around 6:00 pm, prior to the Livestock Sale at the Livestock Arena. All other pies will be sold at a set price to the public after the judging results are announced.
